# 2005 Fireworks! Is This White Lakes Last Fireworks Display?

Over the past few years the WLCL has received various complaints on the fireworks display, from the length of our display being too short, to the shells (fireworks) not being projected high enough in the sky for our lakefront and lake access owners to view.

So with this in mind, the WLCL Board of Directors approved an increase of \$2,200 in the 2005 fireworks budget (to \$7,200). This budget, and a special one-year concession from our new supplier will allow a "best ever" show this summer.

As you may be aware, the WLCL is a non-profit, volunteer organization. We rely on membership dues and fireworks donations to fund our lake events: fireworks, boat parade, and various other lake projects. This year's collection of the 2005 fireworks donations will be key in our decision for the 2006 fireworks. We will monitor our

donations and, if we are unable to fully fund the 2005 fireworks, this may be our last. White Lake has approximately 584 lakefront owners and 833 lake access property owners. If each owner paid \$10 we would have almost enough for the 2005 & 2006 fireworks. Please support our local fireworks by donating and

volunteering your time.

We all enjoy being on the lake during the fireworks display and seeing them from the convenience of our homes and boats, but without your financial support, this may be our last show.

The Beautification committee is researching other local lake associations to determine the procedures, costs, and lessons learned on the various projects:

- designing, developing, and maintaining lake signage along the road/lakeside
- installing walking/bike paths along major lake roads
- creating and installing utility pole flags around lake property

The next beautification meeting is scheduled for January 11, 2005.

Communication/Membership-Chair-Lynn Ross- 248-887-4428. Goals are to improve communication, increase WLCL membership by 20% for 2005, create and develop a website, etc.

The Communication Committee has set a goal to increase membership by going door-to-door, starting with the 584+ waterfront homeowners. This massive effort will require volunteers to solicit 10-20 of their neighbors informing them of the benefits of being a WLCL member. The lake will be sectioned off into blocks of 10-20 homes and each block will require a "Block Captain". Each block captain will receive an informational package that will aid them in the solicitation process. The package will contain:

- Sample Script
- Name badge
  - Highlight informational flyer

Newsletter

- New member sheet
- Membership card

The packet will include information on the Fireworks, Weed Control, Dredging and how they can get involved and become a member.

The communication committee is also rolling out an informational website that will allow our members to keep informed 24/7. The site is expected to be online mid-January 2005.

These actions should increase membership and establish faster and more regular communication. Newsletters will be more frequent and delivered via internet or mailed to those who do not have internet access. If
