2010 SUMMER CELEBRATIONS

Monday, May 31, 2010: The 3rd Annual Memorial Day Pancake Breakfast will be held at the White Lake Inn from 8:30 - 11:30 am.

Saturday, July 3, 2010: The Annual Boat Parade will start at 2:15 pm at the bay near Mitchell's Marina.

Saturday, July 3, 2010: The premium 2-barge Fireworks Display will begin at dusk.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Last year was marked by several accomplishments which I believe make living on White Lake an even greater experience. Members of your WLCL Board of Directors presented a three year **Water Quality Plan** to the White Lake Improvement Board at a Public Hearing. The plan was approved, and included a continuation of the weed control program, water quality testing, and a dredging study for a potential dredging project in the next assessment cycle. The special assessment of \$150.00 per year (for 2010 - 2012) was also approved, and it represents a \$70.00 per year reduction over the average of the assessments from the previous five years. Our efforts on water quality and weed control have kept the lake relatively clear of non-native nuisance plants, while maintaining the lake for good fishing.

Many of you, along your neighbors and friends, enjoyed the **2nd Annual Memorial Day Breakfast** at the White Lake Inn. This, together with the sale of theme T-shirts and other merchandise, contributed over \$4,000.00 to our fireworks fund. We had a great **July 4th Boat Parade** and a spectacular **Fireworks Display.** I am sure that many of you - based on your horn blasts, e-mails, and phone messages - feel as I do, that it was the best display ever.

Last year's **fireworks display** was a "premium" show (the actual classification name used by our fireworks vendor). It cost about \$18,000, as compared to the \$13,000 that we have paid in past years - allowing a longer show, larger shells, and launched from 2 barges instead of one. Fund raising and successful membership drives allowed us to put on this display. This year we will again have an equally spectacular "premium" display, because you liked it so much, and because the funds are available and should be returned to the lake for events like this. That is what we are all about.

However, last year fewer than 40 percent of the over 600 lakefront residents became WLCL members. Average contributions (combined dues and fireworks fund donations) were about \$50.00 per family. This was understandably down from the previous year. In order to continue with "premium" fireworks shows in future years, we don't need the same people contributing more, but we need but more residents joining and contributing. If you enjoyed last year's show and you aren't already a member, please consider joining the WLCL this year, and contribute whatever you can afford.

This year, we will again have a **Memorial Day Breakfast** at the White Lake Inn. This is a great opportunity to get together with your friends and neighbors to kick off the summer season on the lake. More details on this event, as well as the **Fireworks** and **Boat Parade** are in this newsletter.

We will also again have a **Memorial Day Ceremony** at noon. "Taps" will be played while the flag is at half mast, and then as is tradition, the flag will be raised to full mast while we all join in singing the National Anthem. This is a very fitting way that we as a community can remember those who have have made the Ultimate Sacrifice for their country, and can celebrate the freedoms which that sacrifice has preserved for all of us.

WEED CONTROL AND LAWN CARE

Two years ago *Sonar* was used on a one time lake-wide treatment. *Sonar* is a systemic (aimed at the root) herbicide, and is used on a once-per-three-year interval. It targets *Eurasian Milfoil* and *Curly-Leaf Pondweed*, two non-native nuisance plants. Since this treatment will have somewhat lessened residual effect this year, we can expect that these plants will have greater growth, and will require more treatment with contact herbicides than last year.

Surveys last year found that *Starry Stonewort*, a third non-native nuisance plant, was becoming more prevalent in the lake, and could reach nuisance levels this year. This plant is actually a type of algae, which forms dense mats when it anchors itself to bottom of the lake. It blocks out the growth of both good and bad plants, and can have an adverse affect on the fish population. It becomes a further nuisance when it grows to heights of 6 - 7 feet. We expect to treat this plant in early-May, in similar manner to how we have treated other algae over the years. As in the past, detailed notices of all treatments will be posted. Treatments will be performed by licensed applicators using chemicals approved by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ).

Although we survey the lake periodically, it still helps when you use the Hotline (248-887 -5658) to report weed control complaints. You can be assured that we will respond to your calls within a couple of days.

To help control weed growth and the formation of muck, all riparian's (lakefront property owners) are urged to use lawn fertilizer sparingly. The Michigan Lakes and Streams Association suggests using two fertilizer applications per year: a treatment in the spring, and another one in late summer. Fertilizers with no phosphorous, such as 23-0-6, are recommended. If you use a lawn care service, ask if they use zero-phosphorous fertilizers. To further minimize the effects of fertilizer run-off into the lake, a barrier of rocks, railroad ties, or bushes can help.


THE 2010 SUMMER CELEBRATIONS ARE COMING...

E-MAIL COMMUNICATIONS

Whether or not you're a member of the White Lake Citizens League, you can receive up-to-date information and reminders about lake and lake-area activities by joining the WLCL e-mail list. Since this printed newsletter is only mailed once a year, the website and these e-mails are your best way to keep up on White Lake information.

Here are the promises we make:

- · e-mail addresses are always hidden from view on all communications
- e-mail addresses are never supplied or sold to any other organization
- e-mails are always short and easy to read, and never contain graphics or pictures (which can slow their downloading on some systems)
- e-mails are limited to 1 or 2 a month, except around special events (like the Boat Parade)
- you can ask to have your name removed from the list at any time

Presently 173 WLCL members (67% of the membership), 137 non-members, and 5 businesses are on the master list to receive e-mail communications. E-mail addresses are removed from the list when the carrier "bounces" a message back indicating that the address is no longer valid... so you may have formerly received the e-mails, changed carriers, and forgotten to notify us of your new e-mail.

If you haven't been receiving e-mails lately, you can add your e-mail address to the list by sending an e-mail to communication@wlcl.org, or by including it on your membership form (please print carefully... some e-mails "bounce" because they are difficult to read on the form!)

2010 MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

As you've read, the White Lake Citizens League's only source of funding for our activities, including the fireworks display, is from membership dues and donations. Our 2010 Membership Drive is just getting under way.

Similar to past years, our membership drive will proceed as follows: after allowing a few weeks for residents to mail in their membership form (included with this newsletter), "Block Captains" will begin to contact those residents from whom we haven't heard.

Block Captains are your neighbors, who enjoy getting out and meeting their neighbors, and getting a chance to chat about the value of WLCL membership. The lakefront areas are divided into 40 blocks, most containing about 10-20 homes. LAKE HOME TOUR

Everybody's done it... we cruise around the lake looking at the shoreline, and say to our friends "Gee... I wish I could see what that house is like on the inside". Well, the Citizens League is in the process of planning a Home Tour of some of the distinctive houses on the lake for a Saturday or Sunday this summer.

A strictly limited number of tickets will be available for sale (WLCL members will pay a reduced price), and the proceeds will help support the fireworks and other lake activities.

2010 SHERIFF'S MARINE PATROLS

As you may have read, the Oakland County Sheriff has announced that, due to budget cuts, it must reduce or eliminate Marine Patrols on Oakland County inland lakes this year. The Sheriff's Marine Division has indicated that it will continue to provide a deputy to patrol any lake at a cost of \$32 per hour.

Many of you have already expressed concern about this decision, and its impact on White Lake. As this newsletter goes to press, the WLCL and the White Lake Improvement Board (WLIB) are exploring the possibility that WLIB funds could be used to pay for marine patrols on White Lake this summer. It must first be determined if this expense would be a legally acceptable Lake Board expenditure, and if it is determined to be so, the WLIB would be required to conduct a public hearing to amend the Special Assessment District budget adopted last fall.

In the meantime, we are collecting public opinion and comments about several options with a poll on the website. While this poll is completely non-binding, it may be helpful as the WLIB and the WLCL examine possible funding. Please register your opinion using the link on the home page at www.wlcl.org.

We will continue to keep you updated, through e-mails and the website, about any new information and developments in this area.
